ACADEMIC and SCHOOL

- A review of the Higher School Certificate results for 2016 indicates that generally the school performed well. We had several students achieve Band 6 results in Industrial Technology and PDHPE.
- Our destination survey for Year 12, 2016 indicates that of the 73 students who graduated 31 received university places and 15 of those were offered early entry. 20 have taken up apprenticeships, 21 have entered the workforce an 19 have gone into agriculture related work or studies.
