**2017 HIGHLIGHTS**



## **ACADEMIC and SCHOOL**

- A review of the Higher School Certificate results for 2017 indicates that generally the school performed well. We had 9 students achieve Band 6 results in Industrial Technology, Maths, Senior Science, Biology, Primary Industries and two in Drama, which is a first for Farrer. 50 Band 5s were also achieved.
- Our Destination Survey for Year 12—2017 indicated that of the 85 students: 45 received Course University placements offers; 17 Apprenticeships; 15 Agriculture related careers; Workforce - 12 and ADFA - 3.
- **Ongoing relationship with the following Universities:** Students visiting Sydney Uni, UNSW, Macquarie Uni, UNE, Newcastle Uni, Bond University. The following Uni's visited us Charles Sturt Uni, University of QLD, Southern Cross Uni plus the Defence Forces.
- **Course that we ran at Farrer-:**
- 80 students completed the Occupation Health and Safety White Card Construction Course.
- 15 students completed a senior First Aid.
- 10 students completed a lifeguard course.
- 20 Year 10 students completed Cert I in Financial Literacy.
- All year 10 were run through small workshops by Tracey Cullen from "Style For You" focussing on making a good first impression.
- Skills Road ran workshops for all of Year 9 and 10 in 2 large presentations and 2 small presentations.
- 25 students attended the Health Careers Forum by the University of Newcastle.
- All Year 10's and Year 12's attended the Regional Careers.
- The Smith Family ran several workshops over the year, bringing together industry, oldboys and recruitment personal from Peel Valley Employment.
- All Year 10's completed 2 weeks work experience in December.

- Students at Farrer have achieved strong results in 2017 HSC. In Industrial Technology, students performed well in the production of projects and folios with at an exceptional level of achievement by Samuel Barden and Jack Foley achieving Band 6 (top 10% of their cohort in the HSC) and nine Band 5 results in Industrial Technology. In Engineering Studies students were also credited with strong results. For most students their HSC result in the TAS subject was their best overall.
- Additional to the HSC success, two students had their projects nominated by markers for the annual InTech Display in Sydney. InTech is an exhibition of outstanding Major Project's for Industrial Technology. These projects were made by Liam Martin (IT-Metal) and Samuel Orman (IT-Multimedia).

## AGRICULTURE

- Farrer Year 9 Wool Science students competed in the Northern Schools Prime Lamb Competition achieving good results
- Students competed in the Junior Meat Sheep Judging against 90 other students for across the North West of the state
- Students participated in junior judging for beef cattle, sheep meat, fleece and Merino sheep at the Tamworth Show.
- The Farrer Annual Angus Bull Sale took place in June. This year's sale saw the top price for a Farrer Bull reach \$14,500 and a gross of approximately \$345,000.
- The 2016 steer show team achieved outstanding results at Singleton and Northern Schools Competitions – a large number of awards were achieved: Northern School Comp: Champion on Hook, various 1st in class. Singleton: Reserve Champion Led Steer-Hoof.
